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- 1 **Hoboro Island** ep. 8  
  
 35 min.  
 Everyone's favorite Okonomiyaki restaurant "Hoboro" was named after this uninhabited island.
- 2 **Mt. Asahi** ep. 9  
  
 25 min.  
 A view of Takehara and the Setouchi Islands, where Potte encouraged the broken hearted girl.
- 3 **Kamogawa River Bank** ep. 12  
  
 10 min.  
 When Sayomi drove off the road here, everyone had to welcome the first sunrise from this location.
- 4 **Takehara Port** ep. 6  
  
 10 min.  
 The place where Norie and Maon became friends. You can take the Tamayura ferry from Takehara port.
- 5 **Kobuki Bamboo Forest** ep. 9  
  
 12 min.  
 The place where Momonekosama and the wild boar had their great fight. Soft and fragrant bamboo shoots can be found in the spring.
- 6 **Eden Ocean Parking** ep. 5  
  
 4 min.  
 The parking area that Sayomi stopped at when going with friends to Mt. Kurotaki on foot from downtown Takehara. Going by car is much easier though!
- 7 **Tadanoumi Station** ep. 5  
  
 7 min.  
 The station that Chihiro mistook for Takehara station. There are sightseeing spots such as Aohata Jam Deck and Mt. Kurotaki in Tadanoumi.
- 8 **Mt. Kurotaki Sakura Hall** ep. 5  
  
 10 min.  
 A hall halfway up to Mt. Kurotaki where Chihiro and friends grew closer. In the spring, there are many cherry blossoms.
- 9 **Rekishi No Mieru Oka Park** ep. 6  
  
 10 min.  
 The park where Maon whistled for the first time as a child. You can see the Kurushima strait and the mountains of Shikoku from the hill overlooking the Mitarai district.
- 10 **Otomeza Theater** ep. 4  
  
 10 min.  
 Built in 1937, Maon told stories here in Episode 11.  
 Note:  
 It takes about 40 minutes to Mitarai port and 45 minutes to Ocho port by high speed ferry.

Set in Takehara, Tamayura is about a high school student named Sawatari Fu (Nicknamed Potte).

It's a heartwarming story about daily life and the modest dreams of the people surrounding her. Shochiku Co., Ltd. released the anime on Blu-Ray and DVD in 2010, and the show was broadcast on TV in 2011 as Tamayura ~hitotose~

- 1 **Okaeiri Nasai** ep. 1  
  
 15 min. walk  
 "Okaeiri nasai" means "Welcome Home" and is written in front of Takehara station as a greeting. Potte saw it when she moved from Yokosuka to Takehara.
- 2 **Isonomiya Hachiman Shrine** ep. 12  
  
 10 min. walk  
 The Shinto Shrine that Potte and her friends visited for New Year's Day. A river used to connect to the sea here, and the shrine was named for this reason.
- 3 **Hi no Maru Photo Studio** from opening  
  
 2 min. walk  
 The photo studio that Potte often visits. The studio is currently closed.
- 4 **Old Kasai Residence** ep. 10  
  
 5 min. walk  
 The house where Potte and her friends held their gallery. Built in the 5th year of the Meiji Period by a salt merchant.
- 5 **Saiho-ji Temple** ep. 4  
  
 2 min. walk  
 The stone steps of this temple were used in the opening song. This temple has a Fumeikaku, a hall dedicated to Kannon said to have been built in imitation of Kyoto's Kiyomizu Temple.
- 6 **Fumeikaku** ep. 5  
  
 5 min. walk  
 A favorite place for everyone to gather. Has a beautiful view of Takehara. It is the tallest landmark in the historic district.
- 7 **Shokei Square** ep. 7  
  
 2 min. walk  
 A tunnel made of bamboo. It is lit up in the Shokei No Michi festival held every autumn.
- 8 **Okakaé Jizo** ep. 5  
  
 3 min. walk  
 If you hold a Jizo while making a wish, it is thought that the wish will come true if the Jizo feels lighter than expected.
- 9 **Ebisu-do Hall** ep. 2  
  
 3 min. walk  
 Built in the Edo era, this building is thought to house the God of business prosperity. It is the border between the historic area and the rest of the city and helps block lines of sight.
- 10 **Shoren-ji Temple** ep. 12  
  
 3 min. walk  
 The temple where Potte and her friends rang the bell on New Year's Eve. Another bell displayed here, named Komano Kane is a national cultural heritage item.
